Chapman's Creek

A serene birding stop characterized by mature mid- and upperstory habitat. There is a good likelihood of finding woodpeckers (including Pileated), Red-eyed Vireos, Summer Tanagers, Wood Thrushes, Great Crested Flycatchers, Broad-winged Hawks, and Wild Turkeys.

Coosa WMA Trail/Double Bridges

One of the five "birdiest" sites visited in this region. Many bird species not detected at any other site were found here — songbirds, raptors, and game birds.

Coosa Wildlife Management Area and Shooting Range

Located 5.5 miles north of Kelley's Crossroads on Highway 22 (GPS Coordinates 32. 545450| -86. 210234)

The Coosa WMA Shooting Range provides shooting opportunities at distances up to 100 yards. The range has a concrete parking space for one vehicle that provides wheelchair access to the shooting benches.

Duke Ranch Riding Club

Offers a riding arena, 40 acres of trails, access to a three mile wooded dirt road, 25 acres of pasture to ride your horse and a two-acre fishing pond that is stocked with bass and bluegill. The trails are wooded with running streams to ride through. There are picnic tables near the stream, along the trails, so you can enjoy lunch, surrounded by nature. Membership is required.

The Hatchet Creek corridor is secluded and natural, and offers stunning backcountry scenery to outdoor adventurists.

Pinhoti National Recreation Trail

Alabama's premier backcountry hiking trail that extends along the highland "spine" of Alabama, from Flagg Mountain in Coosa County to Indian Mountain in Cherokee County, a distance of 171 miles. From Cherokee County, the trail enters Georgia, ultimately connecting to the Appalachian Trail in north Georgia. The Coosa County section of the Pinhoti includes a new 5.3-mile section of woodland trail. The Pinhoti Trail is also a designated section of the 5,400-mile Eastern Continental Trail, which extends from southern Florida to Newfoundland, Canada, and the 1,800-mile Great Eastern Trail, which runs west of the Appalachian Trail from Alabama to New York.
