2025

Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) calls attention that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every person in our community. SAAM aims to raise public awareness about sexual violence and to educate communities and individuals on how to prevent it;

Whereas, rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment harm our community, and statistics show one in six women and one in 33 men will be raped at some point in their lives. (Rainn.org)

Whereas, child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in ten children will experience sexual assault before age 18. (National Children's Alliance)

Whereas, on Campus, one in five women and one in 16 men are sexually assaulted during their time in college (Krebs, Lindquist, Warner, Fisher, & Martin, 2007)

Whereas, the theme of this year's Sexual Assault Awareness Month Campaign is "Together We Act, United We Change". The campaign emphasizes the importance of collective action in addressing and preventing sexual abuse, assault and harassment.

Whereas, ending sexual abuse, assault, and harassment requires more than individual action, together, we have the power to build a future free from violence, where all individuals feel safe, valued, and respected.

Whereas, we join advocates and communities across the country in taking action to prevent sexual violence. April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month and each day of the year is an opportunity to create change for the future; and

Financial Settlement Services (FSS) Addendum

This Addendum is between Liquidity Service Operations LLC dba GovDeaks, having its principal place of business at 6931 Arlington Road - Suite 460 - Bethesda, Maryland 20814, and Coosa County Commussion 9709 HWY 231, Rockford, AL 35136, P.O. Box 10, Rockford, AL 35136

It is understood the Seller elects GovDeals to collect all proceeds due the Seller from the winning buyer and remit the proceeds to the Seller less the GovDeals fee.

GovDeals will charge the winning buyer a "Buyer's Premium", therefore, the Seller is not allowed to charge the winning buyer an additional "Buyer's Premium".

GovDeals will collect all proceeds from the winning buyer, including the "Buyer's Premium" through PayPal, credit card or wire transfer. This is the only means of payment by the buyer.

The Seller will not release an asset to the winning buyer until the Seller has received verification from GovDeals that payment has been received from the winning buyer. Prior to an item being released to the winning buyer, the Seller will ensure the winning buyer or his/her agent has signed a "Bill of Sale" containing the following notation: "Asset is sold as is, where is and without warranty. Once the asset is removed from the seller's premises there is no refund of monies previously paid". The Bill of Sale must be printed from the Seller Asset Management (SAM). Any other "Bill of Sale" used by the Seller must be submitted to GovDeals for approval.

No proceeds will be remitted to the Seller for any asset sold without verification of payment from GovDeals and verification from the Seller the item has been picked up by the winning buyer. Approved payment from the winning buyer through PayPal, credit card, or wire transfer will be noted in SAM. It is the Seller's responsibility to notify GovDeals when an item has been picked up, which is accomplished by the Seller accessing SAM and selecting the "Picked Up" option from the "Paid, not picked up" report.

GovDeals will remit all proceeds collected, less the "Buyer's Premium" and the GovDeals fee (if applicable) to the Seller on a weekly basis for all assets marked in SAM as 'Picked Up'. All proceeds will be remitted electronically by Automatic Clearing House (ACH) or Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). A detailed statement will be emailed to the Seller supporting the amount remitted.

Under no circumstance will the Seller collect any proceeds directly from the winning buyer and if requested to do so, the Seller should refer the winning buyer directly to GovDeals for payment instructions.

GovDeals will absorb all costs of chargebacks by PayPal or a credit card company where an item is removed by the winning buyer after the Seller receives proper payment notification from GovDeals, GovDeals receives proper pickup notification from the Seller and the Seller obtained and retained a signed "Bill of Sale" from the winning buyer.

GovDeals will refund proceeds collected to the winning buyer in those rare occasions where the winning buyer pays for an asset but never picks it up. It is the Seller's responsibility to request a credit on the asset paid for but not picked up as soon as the allowable pick up time passes. GovDeals is covered by a Crime Insurance Policy with a limit of \$5,000,000, which will protect the Seller against any loss of funds.

Resolution Naming Thomas Cleveland Memorial Bridge

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission, governing body of Coosa County, recognizes and honors the late Thomas Cleveland, lifelong resident of Coosa County, by naming the bridge that crosses Ray Creek on Coosa County Road 75, **Thomas Cleveland Memorial Bridge**; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Cleveland was drafted into the military to serve in World War II in April 1943 and was trained in demolition. He received his first injury while training with TNT after a detonation cap exploded in his hand; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Cleveland received his first Purple Heart after being shot in the shoulder in Normandy, France. The bullet was never removed from his shoulder. The metal covered Bible that he carried, still has blood stains on it from the gunshot wound; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Cleveland received his second Purple Heart after being injured during the Battle of the Bulge; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Cleveland served in World War II for three years. He received a battle-field promotion from private first class to sergeant after being reunited with his unit after being separated when Germans were encountered; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we express our gratitude by honoring Mr. Thomas Cleveland as a treasured member of Coosa County and for his service to our country and a lifetime of sacrifice, dedication, and accomplishments; and

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the powers of the Coosa County Commission, all members concurring; that we do hereby name Thomas Cleveland Memorial Bridge in honor of Mr. Thomas Cleveland.


