

AGREEMENT FOR HOUSING OF MUNICIPAL PRISONERS IN THE COOSA COUNTY JAIL

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Coosa County, a body corporate, herein referred to as "COOSA"; the Sheriff of Coosa County, Alabama, herein referred to as the "SHERIFF"; and the City of Goodwater, Alabama, a municipal corporation, herein referred to as "GOODWATER".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, GOODWATER is in need of assistance to provide adequate jail facilities for the housing, safekeeping and subsistence for persons who have, through due process of law, become prisoners of the Goodwater Police Department and GOODWATER is willing to pay for such facilities and services; and

WHEREAS, COOSA has such facilities which it is willing to make available and is willing to provide the services required upon the terms and conditions herein stated; and

WHEREAS, the SHERIFF consents to the use of said jail facilities and personnel under his control and supervision upon the terms and conditions herein stated;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and the covenants and agreements herein set forth, COOSA, the SHERIFF and GOODWATER covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. <u>DUTY TO ACCEPT</u>: The Coosa County Sheriff's Office will accept from GOODWATER those prisoners as arrested and brought to the county jail by the Goodwater Police Department. (NOTE: This Agreement does not apply to any person charged with a FELONY offense. Those persons are to be housed in the county jail at no charge to the municipality.)
- 2. <u>SUPERVISION OF INMATES</u>: The Sheriff's Office will provide sufficient personnel to supervise and monitor the prisoners of GOODWATER housed in the county jail.
- 3. PROTOCOL FOR BOOKING OF PRISONERS. The Sheriff may

accepting prisoners along with information needed to process GOODWATER prisoners into the county jail.

- 4. MEDICAL TREATMENT OF PRISONERS: The SHERIFF shall determine all necessary medical treatment for GOODWATER prisoners during their confinement in the county jail and GOODWATER shall pay for all medications and medical treatment expenses incurred, upon notice of charges by a medical provider, from the SHERIFF or COOSA. Upon request from Sheriff's Office personnel, GOODWATER shall provide transportation to and from medical facilities or doctors treating the prisoner.
- 5. MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS: The Sheriff's Office shall maintain records for all prisoners housed at the county jail.
- DISCHARGE OF PRISONERS FROM JAIL: The SHERIFF shall not release any GOODWATER prisoner without written authorization from GOODWATER or a Court Order directing the release.
- 7. <u>COMPENSATION FOR HOUSING</u>: GOODWATER agrees to pay the following amounts per day (or portion thereof) for each of its prisoners housed in the county jail:

\$15.00 to **SHERIFF** <u>\$ 5.00</u> to **COOSA** \$20.00 Total

An itemized invoice shall be submitted at the beginning of each month and shall be payable no later than the 10th day of the month.

- 8. MUTUAL COOPERATION: The Sheriff's Office and Police Department of GOODWATER shall endeavor to cooperate and coordinate fully to ensure the success of this Agreement.
- 9. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: Should COOSA, the SHERIFF or any of their officers, agents or employees be sued or have claims filed against them by a municipal prisoner as a result of the negligence, wantonness or other tort committed by GOODWATER, its officers, agents or employees, then in such event, GOODWATER agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and reimburse COOSA, the SHERIFF and their officers, agents and employees for the cost of defense including cost of attorney fees and any damages awarded as a result of any lawsuit or claim filed.
- 10. <u>TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT</u>: After an initial six (6) month period from the date of execution of this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice.

- (B) Should ROCKFORD, its officers, agents or employees be sued or have claims filed against them by a county prisoner as a result of the negligence, wantonness or other tort committed by COOSA, the SHERIFF or any of their officers, agents or employees, then in such event, COOSA, the SHERIFF and any of their officers, agents or employees agree to indemnify, hold harmless and reimburse ROCKFORD, its officers, agents and employees for the cost of defense including cost of attorney fees and any damages awarded as a result of any lawsuit or claim filed.
- 10. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT: After an initial six (6) month period from the date of execution of this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice.
- DURATION: This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until modified or terminated by the parties in writing.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day Proclamation

WHEREAS, Coosa County elderly and disabled adults are valued members of society; and

WHEREAS, the number of older citizens is fast growing and the incidence of abuse, neglect, and exploitation of older adults is outpacing the growth of the population; and

WHEREAS, abuse of older and disabled people is a significant and complex social and health problem that impacts all cultural, social, economic, and demographic groups; and

WHEREAS, combating abuse of people who are elderly or have a disability will help improve the quality of life for all seniors and adults in this county and will allow seniors and adults who have a disability to continue to live as independently as possible and contribute to the life and vibrancy of Coosa County; and

WHEREAS, Coosa County seniors and disabled adults have a right to live free of abuse, neglect, and exploitation and to be treated with respect and dignity to enable them to be valued members of this community; and

WHEREAS, Coosa County and the Adult Protective Services program of Coosa County Department of Human Resources are committed to working closely with community partners to protect and provide for the needs of our older and disabled citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission recognizes the need for a public transportation program; and

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission is recognized as a member of the Coosa County Transportation Steering Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission recognizes that the requirements to obtain Section 5311 funds from the Alabama Department of Transportation includes a local match of 50% for operating expenses and 20% for administration and capital expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission recognizes that the local match will be a shared cost with other participating municipalities being responsible for providing an appropriate allocation of local non-federal funds to secure the operating of the Section 5311 Nonurbanized Area Public Transportation Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Coosa County Commission hereby commits the amount of \$22,482 as local non-federal match for capital, administrative and operations expenditures under the Section 5311 Nonurbanized Area Public Transportation Program during Fiscal Year 2025.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission Chairman is authorized to execute an agreement with the East Alabama Regional Planning and Development Commission for provision of transit services in Coosa County and that the Chairman is also authorized to execute any certifications and assurance required in conjunction with the program.

RESOLUTION FOR ALLOCATION OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS TO CARRY OUT A PUBLIC PURPOSE PROJECT

WHEREAS, Coosa County, Alabama ("the County") has received American Rescue Plan Act state and local fiscal recovery funds ("ARPA funds") and is charged with ensuring that such funds are expended in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of final rule published by the United States Department of Treasury dated January 6, 2022, the County has duly elected to designate a standard allowance of up to \$10,000,000 of its ARPA funds, not to exceed the County's total ARPA funds award, as revenue replacement ("revenue replacement funds"); and

WHEREAS, these public funds may be used for the purpose of providing government services, including investments community engagement programs to promote healthier lifestyles for its citizens; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Alabama Code (1975) §11-1-10, the County may provide funds to a state agency to support any beneficial development in the public's interest; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System of Auburn University (the "Extension") has submitted a request for funding in support of the County's I-HOPE project to provide education, programming, and resources to the community, including, but not limited to, programming to enhance the health and well-being of the community through nutrition education ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Coosa County Commission ("Commission") has determined that the Project is a necessary, eligible, and reasonable use of these funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION as follows:

- 1) The Commission hereby allocates ARPA funds designated as revenue replacement funds to cover up to \$25,000.00 in funds or equivalent value towards purchasing equipment and materials needed to support the Project.
- 2) The Commission hereby directs the Commission Chair to enter into negotiations with the Extension for a funding and/or equipment agreement and memorandum of understanding consistent with this Resolution, applicable state and federal law or regulations, and the terms and conditions of the County's ARPA award.
- 3) The Commission further delegates the authority for the Commission Chair to enter into a funding and/or equipment agreement and memorandum of understanding, provided that the agreement comports with Paragraph 2 of this Resolution and if, in her discretion, the terms and conditions of the agreement are in the best interest of the County.
- 4) Upon execution of the agreement, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to expend ARPA funds revenue replacement funds for costs of the Project in accordance with the terms of this Resolution and the funding agreement.

- 5) The County ARPA Program Director is responsible for ensuring that, in carrying out the obligations under the agreement, the Project meets the requirements of the County's ARPA award, that no funds will be expended on ineligible costs as defined by Treasury's Final Rule, and that the Project will not frustrate the County's ability to mitigate or prevent against the spread of COVID-19.
- 6) Expenditure of these funds, as authorized by this Resolution, shall be contingent on the continued appropriation and availability of ARPA funds for this purpose and in no event shall be used for any costs associated with the project that are not obligated on or before December 31, 2024, and expended on or before December 31, 2026.
