This Resolution is made this 11th day of December 2018 by the Coosa County Commission to amend Resolution 08142018-1, dated August 14, 2018 to allow the Lake Martin Area Industrial Development Authority (the Granting Authority), to include an increase in capital investment in the tax abatements to be granted to Central Alabama Wood Products (the Company).

WHEREAS, the Company has announced plans to reinvest in their existing facility as part of an addition, expansion, upgrade, improvement, and/or renovation to their existing facility (the Project), located within the jurisdiction of Coosa County; and

WHEREAS, the Company's North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code 321113, meets the qualifications of an approved activity in accordance with Section 40-9G-1(1), *Code of Alabama 1975*; and

WHEREAS, the Company has not entered into a project agreement with the Governor for the provision of other incentives for this project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Alabama Reinvestment and Abatements Act (Section 40-9G-1 et seq., *Code of Alabama 1975*) (the Act) the Company has requested from the Granting Authority an Abatement of (check all that apply):

WHEREAS, the Company has requested that the abatement of county non-educational property taxes be extended for a period of 10 years, in accordance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Granting Authority has found the information contained in the Company's application to be sufficient to permit the Granting Authority to make a reasonable cost/benefit analysis of the proposed project and to determine the economic benefits to the community; and

WHEREAS, the construction of the project will involve a capital investment of \$17,910,837; and

WHEREAS, the Company is duly qualified to do business in the State of Alabama, and has powers to enter into, and to perform and observe the agreements and covenants on its part contained in the Tax Abatement Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Granting Authority represents and warrants to the Company that is has power under that constitution and laws of the State of Alabama (including particularly the provisions of the Act) to carry out the provisions of the Tax Abatement Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Granting Authority as follows:

Section 1. Approval is hereby given to the application of the Company and abatement is hereby granted of (check all that apply):

Coosa County non-educational property taxes, which shall be equal to the excess amount of Coosa County non-educational property taxes owed for the applicable tax year that is greater than the amount of county non-educational property taxes owed for the tax year immediately before the qualifying project was placed in service, specific to the property that is receiving an abatement; and

as the same may apply to the fullest extent permitted by the Act. The period of abatement for the non-educational property taxes (if applicable) shall extend for a period of 10 years measured as provided in Section 40-9G of the Act, as amended from time to time.

Section 2. The governing body of the Granting Authority is authorized to enter into an abatement agreement with the Company to provide for the abatement granted in Section 1.

Section 3. A certified copy of this resolution, with the application and abatement agreement, shall be forwarded to the Company to deliver to the appropriate local taxing authorities (if applicable) and to the Alabama Department of Revenue in accordance with the Act.

Section 4. The governing body of the Granting Authority is authorized to take any and all actions necessary or desirable to accomplish the purpose of the foregoing of this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Granting Authority and the company, in consideration of the mutual promises and benefits specified herein, hereby agree as follows:

In accordance with the Act, the Granting Authority hereby grants to the Company an abatement from liability for the following taxes as permitted by the Act (check all that apply):

5. <u>Compliance</u> . If the Company fails to comply with any provision in this Agreement or if any of the material statements contained herein or in Attachment Two (Note: This attachment shall include the application for abatement), are determined to have been misrepresented whether intentionally, negligently, or otherwise, the Granting Authority shall terminate this Agreement and take such equitable action—available to it as if this Agreement had never existed. If it is determined that certain items, which are identified on the application form for abatement of taxes, are not in compliance with the Act or governing regulations, these items may be subject to texation for all local and state taxing authorities.
6. Binding Agreement. Each party to this Agreement hereby represents and warrants that the person executing this Agreement on behalf of the party is authorized to do so and that this Agreement shall be binding and enforceable when duly executed and delivered by each party. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the parties and their respective successors.

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 11th day of December, 2018 by and between the Coosa County Commission, herein called "Owner", acting herein through Chairman, Todd Adams, and G. Mark Ingram of Gary Ingram Grading and Paving, Inc., County of Tallapoosa, and State of Alabama, herein called "Contractor".

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the payments and agreements hereinafter mentioned, to be made and performed by the OWNER, the CONTRACTOR hereby agrees with the OWNER to commence and complete the construction described as follows:

(SITE 1) COOSA COUNTY ROAD NO. 52 FROM COOSA COUNTY ROAD NO. 66 TO STATE ROUTE NO. 9 AND (SITE 2) COOSA COUNTY ROAD NO. 73 FROM THE TALLAPOOSA COUNTY LINE TO THE END OF THE ROADWAY (RESURFACE AND TRAFFIC STRIPE) PROJECT NO. CY-CM-PF-17-021

hereinafter called the project for the bid sum of \$364,970.67 and all extra work in connection therewith, under the terms as stated in the Project Manual; and at his (its or their) own proper cost and expense to furnish all the materials, supplies, machinery, equipment, tools, superintendence, labor, insurance, and other accessories and services necessary to complete the said project in accordance with the conditions and prices stated in the Proposal, the plans, which include all maps, plats, blue prints, and other drawings and printed or written explanatory matter thereof, the specifications and contract documents therefore as prepared by the Coosa County Highway Department, 17781 US Highway 231, Rockford, Alabama 35136 "Engineer", all of which are made a part hereof and collectively evidence and constitute the contract.

The Contractor hereby agrees to commence work under this contract on or before a date to be specified in a written "Notice to Proceed" of the Owner and to fully complete the project within thirty (30) working days thereafter. The Contractor further agrees to pay, as liquidated damages, the sum of \$ (See ALDOT Specifications) for each working day thereafter as provided in the ALDOT Standard Specifications. The Contractor further agrees to keep all records pertaining to the project on file for a

minimum of five (5) years and to provide the Owner with complete access to all records pertaining thereunto.

The OWNER agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR in current funds for the performance of the contract subject to additions and deductions, as provided in the Project Manual.

By signing this contract, grant, or other agreement, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. BE IT RESOLVED, ORDERED AND DECREED by the Coosa County Commission (herein called "the Commission") as follows:

Section 1. <u>Findings</u>. (a) The Commission hereby finds, determines and declares that there has been filed with the Commission a petition in writing signed by 200 or more qualified electors of the County, who are also freeholders, which petition (except for the signatures) is in words and figures as follows:

TO THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF COOSA COUNTY, ALABAMA:

We, the undersigned qualified electors of Coosa County, Alabama, who are also freeholders of said County, hereby petition and request that you call and cause to be held a special election at the several regularly established voting places in the said County on March 12, 2019, between the legal hours for holding elections, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the said County the question of whether it shall be authorized to renew and continue the annual levy, for a period of thirty (30) consecutive years commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2019 (for which first tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2020), of a special ad valorem tax for public school purposes in said County at the rate of one (1) mill on each dollar (or \$.10 on each \$100) of the assessed value of taxable property in said County, being the tax that was originally authorized and provided for in Section 269, Article XIV, of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901; it being intended that the said special tax to be voted on at the said election shall constitute a renewal and continuation of the said tax, as last voted in the County on February 15, 1994, and shall not constitute an increase in the rate of taxation presently authorized in the County.

The Commission has caused the signatures that were signed to the said petition to be carefully checked as to their authenticity and the names of the signers of the said petition to be checked against the roll of the qualified electors of Coosa County and against the tax rolls of Coosa County, and the Commission has determined that the said petition was signed by more than 200 persons who are duly qualified electors of the County and who are also freeholders.

(b) The Commission hereby further finds, determines and declares that said petition complies in all respects with the applicable provisions of Article 8 of Chapter 13 of Title 16 of the Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. Call of Election. An election shall be and hereby is called to be held in the County on March 12, 2019, between the legal hours for holding elections and at the regular voting places in the County, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the County the question of whether it shall be authorized to renew and continue the annual levy, for a period of thirty (30) consecutive years beginning with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2019 (for which first tax year taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2020, of a special ad valorem tax for public school purposes in the County at the rate of one (1) mill on each dollar (or \$.10 on each \$100) of the assessed value of taxable property in said County, being the tax that was originally authorized and provided for in Section 269 of Article XIV of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901; it being intended that the said special tax to be voted on at the said election shall constitute a renewal and continuation of the said tax and shall not constitute an increase in the rate of taxation presently authorized in the County.

Section 3. <u>Voting Places</u>. The said election called shall be held and conducted at the regularly established voting places in the County except as to the casting of ballots of absent voters as hereinafter provided.

Section 4. <u>Notice of Election</u>. The sheriff of the County is hereby directed to give notice of the said election in the manner prescribed by law, by publication in *The Coosa* for four consecutive weeks prior to the date fixed for said election, the first publication of such notice to be at least thirty days before the date of such election. The said notice to be so published shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR RENEWAL AND CONTINUATION OF THE LEVY OF THE ONE MILL COUNTYWIDE SCHOOL TAX IN COOSA COUNTY

Notice is hereby given that the Coosa County Commission has called and ordered a special election to be held in Coosa County on March 12, 2019, at which there will be submitted to the qualified electors of said County, for their determination by ballot, the question of whether the said County shall be authorized to levy annually, for a period of thirty (30) successive years, commencing with the levy for the tax year that will begin on October 1, 2019 (for which tax year taxes will become payable on October 1, 2020), for public school purposes in said County, a special property or ad valorem tax at the rate of ten cents on each one hundred dollars (equal to one mill on each dollar) of the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the said County. (c) Each absentee ballot shall be accompanied by an envelope on which there shall be printed an affidavit in the form prescribed by law for absent voters for elections held in this state.

The special election to be held in the County on March 12, 2019, shall be held and the results of such election shall be declared in the same manner and by the same officers as the results of regular elections for county officers, under the general election laws of the state.
