



## To file a complaint:

- 1. Report the incident to your department head or elected official.
- 2. If the offender is your department head or elected official, or they are not available, you may report directly to the County Administrator.
- 3. Finally, you may submit a report directly to the Commission Chair if the above mentioned procedures are not convenient or suitable.

## Sexual Harassment described:

Sexual harassment includes unwelcome sexually oriented conduct that is sufficiently pervasive or severe, and may unreasonably interfere with an employee's job performance or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working environment. While sexual harassment encompasses a wide range of conduct, some examples of specifically prohibited conduct include but are not limited to:

- promising, directly or indirectly, an employee special treatment or benefits for complying with a sexually-oriented request;
- threatening, directly or indirectly, to retaliate against an employee if the employee refuses to comply with a sexually-oriented request;
- denying, directly or indirectly, an employee an employment-related opportunity if the employee refuses to comply with a sexually-oriented request;
- engaging in sexually suggestive physical contact or touching another employee in a way that is unwelcome;
- displaying, storing, or transmitting pornographic or sexually oriented materials using Coosa County equipment or facilities;
- commenting about an individual's body, sexual prowess, or sexual deficiencies; making insulting or obscene comments or sexual gestures;
- engaging in indecent exposure; or
- making sexual or romantic advances toward an employee and persisting despite the employee's rejection of the advances.



This policy is a guideline for the establishment and use of the Coosa County Commission owned/funded social media sites as a means of conveying Coosa County information to its citizens.

The intended purpose behind establishing Coosa County social media sites is to disseminate information from the county, about the county to its citizens.

The Coosa County Commission has an overriding interest and expectation in deciding what is "spoken" on behalf of the county, especially on county owned/funded social media sites. The Coosa County Commission allows Department Heads to establish and operate social media policies for their respective departments with the understanding the sites must comply with the Coosa County Social Media Policy. The Coosa County Commission acknowledges the right of Elected Officials to create, or have created, social media outlets to be exclusively maintained by the Elected Officials, and strongly encourages those Elected Officials to adhere to the guideline's established by the Coosa County Commission and to further establish social media policy for their employees who may update or respond to the citizenry via social

For purposes of the policy, "social media" is understood to be content created by individuals, using accessible, expandable, and upgradable publishing technologies, through and on the Internet. Examples of social media include, but are not limited to, Facebook, blogs, RSS, YouTube, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, Flickr. For the purposes of this policy, "comments" include information, articles, pictures, videos or any other form of communicative content posted on a Coosa County social media site.

## **General Policy**

- 1. The establishment and use by any County department on County social media sites are subject to approval by the Coosa County Commission. All Coosa County social media sites shall be administered by the applicable department head.
- 2. Coosa County media sites should make clear that they are maintained by applicable department head, and that they follow the Coosa County Social Media Policy.
- 3. Wherever possible, county social media sites should link back to the official Coosa County website for forms, documents, online services and other information necessary to conduct business with the County of Coosa.
- 4. The Commission staff will occasionally monitor content on all county funded sites and on all affiliated social media sites to ensure adherence to both the County Social Media Policy and the interest and goals of Coosa County.
- 5. The Commission reserves the right to request the removal of any content that is deemed in violation of this Social Media Policy or any applicable law. The removal of such content must be retained by the department head for a reasonable period of time, including the time, date, and identity of the poster, when available.
- 6. These guidelines must be displayed to users or made available by hyperlink.
- 7. The County will approach the use of social media tools as consistently as possible.
- 8. Coosa County's website at <a href="http://www.coosacountyal.com">http://www.coosacountyal.com</a> will remain the County's primary and predominant internet presence.
- 9. All County social media sites shall adhere to applicable federal, state and local laws, regulation and policies.

- 10. County Social Media sites are subject the Alabama Public Records Law. Any content maintained in a social media format that is related to County business, including a list of subscribers, posted communication, and communication submitted for posting, may be a public record subject to public disclosure.
- 11. Comments on topics or issues not within the jurisdictional purview of Coosa County may be removed.
- 12. Employees representing the County government via County social media sites must conduct themselves at all times as a representative of the County and in accordance with all County policies.
- 13. This Social Media Policy may be revised at any time.

## **Comment Policy**

- 1. As a public entity, the County must abide by certain standards to serve all of its citizens in a civil and unbiased manner.
- 2. Comments containing any of the following inappropriate forms of content shall not be permitted on any Coosa County social media sites and are subject to request for removal and/or restriction by the Coosa County Commission or designees:
  - a. Comments not related to the original topic, including ransom or unintelligible comments:
  - b. Profane, obscene, violent or pornographic content and/or language;
  - c. Content that promotes, fosters or perpetuates discrimination on the basis of race, creed, color age, religion, gender or national origin;
  - d. Defamatory or personal attacks;
  - e. Threats to any person or organization;
  - f. Comments in support of, or in opposition to, any political campaigns or ballot measures;
  - g. Solicitation of commerce, including but not limited to advertising of any business or product for sale;
  - h. Conduct in violation of any federal state or local law;
  - i. Encouragement of illegal activity;
  - i. Information that may tend to compromise the safety or security of the public or public systems; or
  - k. Content that violates a legal ownership interest, such as a copyright, of any party.
- 3. A comment posted by a member of the public on any Coosa County social media site is the opinion of the commentator or poster only, and publication of a comment does not imply endorsement of, or agreement by Coosa County nor does such comments necessarily reflect the opinion or polices of the County of Coosa.
- 4. The County of Coosa reserves the right to deny access to the Coosa County social media sites for any individual who violates the Coosa County's Social Media Policy, at any time and without prior notice.
- 5. Departments shall monitor their social media sites for comments requesting responses from the County and for comments in violation of this policy
- 6. When a Coosa County employee responds to a comment, in his/her capacity as a Coosa County employee, the employee's name and title should be made available and the employee shall not share personal information about himself or herself or other county employees.

Request the following adjustments be made to the Probate Offices' FY17 Budget. These adjustments are requested to allow the Commission to repeal adjustments and increases made during the August 2017 Commission meeting

Because the SYSCON contract started later in FY17 than expected, there are funds available in line item 163, Data Processing Services, to cover most of the adjustments and increases requested in August 2017. However, it should be noted that in FY18, line item 163 will require funding for a full year for the SYSCON contract and cannot be decreased in FY18. This is a temporary solution that will help us to get through FY17 without exceeding budget.

Below are the proposed adjustments.

on the Probate Office account is for the Coosa County EMA. The total charges on that phone line (by end of FY17) will be \$412.00. I expected this phone charge to be removed from the Probate Office account and did not budget for it. I am told the Probate Offices will continue to pay for this phone line. If that is the case, I respectfully request Line Item 251 be increased by \$412.00 and additional funds allocated for these charges. See table below.

Dear Commissioner,

On behalf of the Lake Martin Area Economic Development Alliance Board of Directors, I would like to thank Coosa County for your continued support of our economic development efforts. Your support financially and as Board Members has been invaluable to our economic development efforts.

This past year has been a year of making connections for the Lake Martin area. We have partnered with site consultant Jim Beatty of NCS International and Jim has helped us cultivate relationships with other site consultants, several of which have visited or are planning to visit the Lake Martin area. These site consultants have firsthand knowledge about projects that may be a fit for us and we believe that providing them with information on the Lake Martin area and the many benefits that we have to offer a company looking to expand or relocate, will only increase our chances for positive economic development opportunities.

This past year we have continued our support of our existing industries as well. We continue to serve as a liaison between local industry, Central Alabama Community College, Benjamin Russell High School, Tallapoosa County High Schools and Coosa Central High School. Also, this year, we launched a HR Roundtable program, a group of approximately 75 Human Resource professionals and industry leaders that meet monthly to discuss workforce issues in the area. These meetings enable us to respond to those issues immediately by providing information on training opportunities, facilitating speakers and presentations on relevant subjects or simply by providing an opportunity for these professionals to network with one another. We are also continuing to work with this group to compile a Wage and Benefit survey for the area.

We, of course, also continue to work with our existing industry on any expansions they have. This year Sejin America in the Thweatt Industrial Park in Dadeville added a 50,000 square foot expansion to their existing facility. This expansion will house a production line dedicated to providing parts to new customer Volkswagen. We are also continuing to work with Korens in Alexander City, who plan to be in production by first quarter 2018. We have also fielded interest on the Avondale property in Alexander City, the Lake Martin Regional Industrial Park in Kellyton, Thweatt Industrial Park in Dadeville and the newly purchased acreage on the former Russell Campus that is being developed by the City of Alexander. New projects and expansions brought approximately 200 new jobs and over \$11 million in capital investment to the Lake Martin area in 2016-2017.

I would like to invite you to the Coosa County Extension Office Annual Budget Request and Accountability Luncheon on Tuesday, September 12, 2017. The meeting will take place at the Coosa County Extension Office during your lunch break. During this time, I would like to share with you some of the successes of the Extension Office and present you with the accountability report. If for some reason September 12th is not convenient, I can move the meeting to Tuesday, October 10th. Please let my office know as soon as possible which date is preferred.

Also enclosed is the Coosa County Extension Office budget request for fiscal year 2017-2018. As you know, Extension Offices are able to operate with support through Federal, State and County Funds. A majority of the funding comes from State appropriations but County-matching funds are needed for day-to-day (local) operation within the county.

Alabama Cooperative Extension System and Coosa County Extension Office are very appreciative of the support we receive from our County Commission and value the relationship.

This year, we are requesting funding of \$14,000. A \$200.00 increase from last year. At full staff capacity with 10 regional extension agents working Coosa County, cost for copier, office supplies, publication, etc. have increased. Aside from Extension day-to-day operation, we also serve as the part-time facility for Coosa County Chamber of Commerce. For the past year and a half, Extension has provided not only leadership to the Chamber but has aided them in facility and administrative needs. Their meeting expenses are not large in amount but they have caused a slight variation in Extension's County Budget. In an effort to aid both entities (Extension and Coosa County Chamber of Commerce), I am asking for your consideration in this budget request.

I fully understand the county's budget is limited but asked that you take time to consider what impact the work I have done thus far to assist the county with various projects, grants, etc.

I certainly hope you can join us on September 12th. I look forward to seeing and discussing our 2017-2018 Extension plan with each of you. Please have county administrator contact my office to confirm date and time.
