To be able to complete purce/aplits that will affect the assessment period of the 2022 tax year, which begins October 1, 2021, Fam requesting the line items of the 2020-21 Reappraisal Budget highlighted below be reallocated to provide the temporary assistance from Flagship GIS during the weeks of FMLA for the mapper/appraiser of the revenue office.

Flagship GIS has agreed to map all parcel splits during this leave time at \$75.00 per hour not to exceed \$4,500. With this assistance, the tax maps and new parcels will be updated as deeds are recorded during the FMLA period.

Currently mapping spiks are backlogged due to the CAMA conversion from S&W Minicomputers to Ering Capture and the mapper had to manually re-enter into the Ering software all deeds recorded for the 2021 tax bill. While this work is now complete, all deeds recorded from 10/1/2021 through the present date had to be set aside. With the temporary assistance of Flagship GIS, mapping can be caught up to date and assessments made for the new tax year of 2022.

Whereas the Coosa Creaty Commission and the City of Alexander City on August 10, 2021 are entering into this Intergovernmental Agreement of Understanding for the purpose of clarifying responsibilities concerning Coosa County's 2021 CDBG Economic Development Project (LR-ED-PF-21-????) and that will extend the City of Alexander City sewer collection system to serve Alabama Graphite Products, LLC which is locating in the Kellyton Industrial Park. This AGREEMENT will continue until this project is closed out in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA).

- The City of Alexander City has completed the procurement and selection process for all engineering and administrative services required in connection with the project. These services will be rendered under contract agreement between the City of Alexander City and selected engineering and administrative firms, and payment for these services will be approved by the Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City. Both firms will be responsible for management and implementation of the entire project on behalf of the Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City.
- 2. The Coosa County Commission authorizes the City of Alexander City to serve as its agent in procuring construction contracts. In so delegating this responsibility to the City of Alexander City the Coosa County Commission requires that all CDBG rules, regulations, and guidelines be adhered to and the City of Alexander City agrees to abide by said rules, regulations and guidelines. It is further agreed that any change to the project design or service area, or any need for modification of any contract for engineering or construction service will, by necessity of the CDBG funding, require notification and approval by the Coosa County Commission. The City of Alexander City agrees to provide such notification in writing within sufficient time to allow for the County Commission to file a local or formal amendment with ADECA.
- 3. The County Commission retains the right to review and approve/disapprove all payments to the administrator, engineer and the contractor(s).
- 4. The City of Alexander City agrees to provide copies of all contracts, pay estimates, invoices, and other relevant project correspondence to the Coosa County Commission.

- The City of Alexander City agrees to allow accessibility of its records and 5. files, for inspection by the Coosa County Commission, State Examiners Office, ADECA, HUD, and other monitoring agencies.
- 6. As required by CDBG guidelines, the Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City will retain all records for this project for at least five years from the dated of the final accepted audit.
- 7. The City of Alexander City agrees to provide all local matching funds and other resources as may be required to complete the project as set forth in the County's grant Application.
- All CDBG grant funds will flow through the Coosa County Commission to 8. the City of Alexander City upon receipt of invoices.
- All project invoices must be signed by the Coosa County Administrator and 9. the Mayor of the City of Alexander City.
- The Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City must maintain 10. either original or copies of all records.
- The Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City must journalize 11. all financial transactions on this project in its books and have proper source
- The Course County Commission and City of Alexander City will be fully 12. responsible to the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs for carrying out the project in accordance with ADECA's CDBG regulations. This responsibility includes administration and expenditure of CDBG and
- The Coosa County Commission will establish a separate fund number within 13. the county's financial accounting system for this project and City of Alexander City will open a separate checking account for this project.
- The Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City agree to accept 14. responsibility for complying with ADECA's CDBG bookkeeping and financial accounting requirements respecting use of CDBG funds and related local matching funds. The Coosa County Commission and City of Alexander City will also maintain accounting records to adequately account for all CDBG and local matching funds.

The Digital Information Cooperative Agreement (hereinafter referred to as Agreement) is entered into as of the day of September 2021 by and between the Coosa County Commission, (hereinafter referred to as COUNTY), and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) (hereinafter jointly referred to as PARTIES).

## RECITALS

WHEREAS, the COUNTY maintains a Geographic Information System that contains a significant variety of digital land information that is used in the daily operation of numerous departments supporting the constituents of Coosa County;

WHEREAS, the ALDOT has entered into a contract to acquire new aerial imagery for the entire County.

WHEREAS, the ALDOT maintains information concerning the planning and maintenance of a statewide system of transportation corridors for the State of Alabama;

WHEREAS, it has been determined that each of the agencies maintain some information that is similar and overlapping;

WHEFEAS, the COUNTY has a need for the digital aerial imagery and mapping for its use and that it is in the best interest of the constituents of these jurisdictions that a cooperative agreement be established to share the costs of development and maintenance of some of these similar data elements; and

NOW THEREFORE, the PARTIES hereto, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as:

# Section 1. Contributions and Responsibilities

- 1.1 Definitions. As used herein the following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them:
  - (a) "Specifications" shall mean those specifications required by the Alabama Department of Revenue's Property Tax Division "Specifications for Property Ownership Maps, GIS/Computer Assisted Property Tax Mapping and Aerial Photography (ADV-25)" document dated November 2004.
  - (b) "Data Set" shall mean the digital and non-digital information, databases, calculations, and products developed or placed to support the 2021 computerized mapping project.
  - 1.2 ALDOT has entered into a contract to acquire 1" = 200' scale aerial imagery in Coosa County. The aerial imagery will be collected in accordance with the Alabama Department of Revenue's Property Tax Division "Specifications".

- (a) The above-mentioned parties agree to hereby formally commit resources to collect aerial imagery thru ALDOT's Statewide Imagery Program. ALDOT will acquire 1" = 200' imagery across Coosa County with a one-foot (1.0') resolution collected to meet the Specifications required by the Alabama Department of Revenue.
- (b) The COUNTY shall pay a lump sum of \$15,000 to ALDOT as a cost share for the aerial imagery. ALDOT will be responsible for funding the balance of the project cost.
- (c) At the conclusion of the project and as a condition of its completion, ALDOT shall deliver to the COUNTY 1" = 200' aerial imagery of Coosa County with a 1.0 foot pixel resolution along with all associated metadata. In addition to said imagery, ALDOT shall provide an invoice to the COUNTY due and payable within ninety (90) days after acceptance and approval of the data set by the COUNTY.
- (d) The COUNTY shall have exclusive use of the resulting Data Set. The Data Set will not have any restrictions of use by the COUNTY.
- (e) In the event the COUNTY develops enhanced products from the aerial imagery, the COUNTY will provide the resulting data set to ALDOT.
- (f) As a member of the Alabama Geographic Information Executive Council, ALDOT shall make the resulting data available to other State and Federal Agencies for their business purposes.

## Section 2. Term and Termination

- 2.01 Term. The term of this Agreement shall commence on the date hereof and shall continue for one year.
- 2.02 Termination. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving a thirty (30) day written notice. Either party may at any time terminate this Agreement in the event of insufficient appropriation of funds. Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason whatsoever, no data will be required to be returned to any other party. The liability for payment of any unpaid fees or obligations shall continue until paid.
- Section 3. Assignment. Neither this Agreement nor any of the rights or duties hereunder may be assigned or otherwise transferred in any way by any party hereto, voluntarily or involuntarily, by operation of law, or otherwise, without the prior written consent of the other party, which consent may be conditioned upon execution of an undertaking by the assignee pursuant to which the assignee agrees to assume the obligations of the assignor and to fulfill the assignor's duties hereunder, but such consent shall not otherwise be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.
- Section 4. Force Majeure. No party is responsible for delays due to causes or occurrences beyond its control including, but not limited to, civil disobedience, acts of God, casualty or accident, war, labor disputes, or the like.
- Section 5. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement will apply to, be binding in all respects

upon, and inure to the benefit of the successors and permitted assigns of the parties.

Section 6. No Third Parties Benefited. This Agreement is made and entered into solely for the benefit of the represented parties, their successors and permitted assigns, and no other person or entity shall have any rights hereunder.

Section 7. Miscellaneous. This Agreement supersedes all prior agreements between the parties with respect to its subject matter and constitutes a complete and exclusive statement of the terms of the agreement between the parties with respect to its subject matter. This Agreement may not be amended except by a written agreement executed by the party to be charged with the amendment. If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, the other provisions of this Agreement will remain in force and effect. Any provision of this Agreement held invalid or unenforceable only in part or degree will remain in full force and effect to the extent not held invalid or unenforceable. The captions used herein are for convenience and shall not control interpretation of the text

Section 8. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Section 9. By entering into this Agreement, the COUNTY COMMISSION is not an agent of the STATE, its officers, employees, agents, or assigns. The COUNTY COMMISSION is an ir dependent entity from the STATE and nothing in this Agreement creates an agency relationship between the parties.

Section 10. By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the Agreement, that they will not violate Federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the Agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.

Section 11. By signing this Contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of this agreement to remain in compliance with Act 2016-312. The Parties hereby agree that they are not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, the boycott of a person or entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with which this state can enjoy open trade.

It is agreed that the terms and commitments contained herein shall not be constituted as a debt of the State of Alabama in violation of Article 11, Section 213 of the Constitution of Alabama, 1901, as amended by Amendment Number 26. It is further agreed that if any provision of this AGREEMENT shall contravene any statute or Constitutional provision of amendment, either now in effect or which may, during the course of this AGREEMENT, be enacted, then the conflicting provision in the AGREEMENT shall be deemed null and void.

When considering settlement of demoverates arising from or related to the work covered by this AGREEMENT, the parties may agree to use appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution.

## TERMINATION DUE TO INSUFFICIENT FUNDS

a. If the agreement term is to exceed more than one fiscal year, then said agreement is subject to termination in the event that funds should not be appropriated for the continued payment of the agreement in subsequent fiscal years.
