County Commission Organizational Meeting

Required First County Commission Meeting

Ala. Code § 11-3-1(e) requires the county commission to meet on the Wednesday 8 days following the election of its members.

In 2022, this meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 16.

- This meeting shall be held in lieu of any regular or other meeting of the county commission.
- The commission cannot meet between the election and this meeting except in a declared emergency.

The law does not prescribe what time the meeting shall take place.

 Regular meeting dates, times, and locations must be posted in the courthouse and the members of the news media, who have filed a written request, must be advised of the regular meeting dates when those dates are established.

Required and Recommended Agenda Items

Ala. Code § 11-3-8(a) requires the county commission to establish its regular meeting days during this "organizational meeting."

• The commission may alter its meeting date schedule as warranted in the future.

• The commission may also call special or emergency meetings under procedures set out in Ala. Code § 11-3-8(b).

Where the chair of the county commission is elected by the body, that also generally takes place during this meeting.

• If the county commission rotates the chair, a schedule setting out the rotation should be distributed to all commission members.

• It is also recommended that a vice chair be elected or appointed at this meeting as authorized in *Ala. Code § 11-3-20*.

Meeting Rules of Procedure

Alabama's Open Meetings Law requires the county commission to adopt written rules of procedure. See Ala. Code § 36-25A-5.

 The commission's rules of procedure shall remain in place until and unless amended by the body.

The "organizational meeting" shall be conducted pursuant to previously-adopted rules.

 Any changes in the rules shall not take effect until the next commission meeting following adoption. Here are the allowed uses for the Capital Improvement Fund per Code of Alabama Section 11-29-6:

-Such funds shall only be used by counties for the following purposes:
- a. Public buildings; counties may expend such funds for the construction, furnishing, equipping, and renovation of public buildings including, without limitation, jails, courthouses and courthouse annexes, juvenile facilities, and paying rentals to public corporations for the use of public buildings. Such funds may also be expended for the purpose of purchasing land for public buildings.
- b. Solid waste; counties may expend such funds for the purchase of land for sanitary landfills, the purchase of solid waste handling and disposal equipment including collection vehicles and landfill compaction equipment, and other solid waste handling and disposal equipment and/or facilities.
- c. Public utilities; counties may expend such funds for public water and waste water treatment facilities and drainage facilities. Such expenditures may include the purchase of land and rights-maintenance of such public facilities.
- d. Roads and bridges; up to 50 percent of the funds received by counties may be expended for the construction, maintenance, reconstruction, restoration, or resurfacing of county roads and bridges.
- e. Bonds and warrants; counties may expend such funds for the payment of any valid obligation of a county that is evidenced by bonds, notes, warrants, or other instruments now or hereafter authorized by law to be issued for any of the purposes enumerated in clauses a, b, c, and d of this paragraph.
- f. Public health; counties may expend funds for the operation and maintenance of the county health department.
- g. Pensions and security; counties may expend funds for the operation and maintenance of the county human resources department.

RESOLUTION FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS FOR GOVERNMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, Coosa County, Alabama (the "County") has received American Rescue Plan Act fiscal recovery funds ("ARPA funds") and is charged with ensuring that such funds are expended in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, under the Final Rule published by the United States Department of Treasury dated January 6, 2022, the County has the option to designate a standard allowance of up to \$10,000,000 of its ARPA funds, not to exceed the County's total ARPA funds award, as revenue replacement ("Revenue Replacement funds"); and

WHEREAS, the Final Rule provides that the designation of this standard allowance is a one-time, irrevocable election that must be made for the period of performance of the ARPA funds award; and

WHEREAS, the County has duly made this election; and

WHEREAS, the County may expend designated Revenue Replacement funds for government services; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that there is a need to provide construction and maintenance to ensure safe public roads that it is within the authority of the County to provide these services:

WHEREAS, the County has determined that the procurement of materials and services to support a Highway Department project on County Road 71 is a necessary, reasonable, and proportionate measure to facilitate the provision of these government services; and

WHEREAS, the County has procured these materials and services in a manner consistent with state laws and guidelines, including compliance the Public Works Law, codified as Title 39 of the Code of Alabama 1975 and the Competitive Bid Law, codified as § 41-16-50, *et seq.*, Code of Alabama 1975, as applicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION as follows:

- 1) The County shall use up to \$344,028.00 of ARPA funds, which are hereby designated as Revenue Replacement funds, to facilitate the provision of the government services to provide appropriate maintenance and construction for the County Road 71 project.
- 3) The Coosa County Commission is hereby authorized to expend these funds to purchase goods and services as described herein from appropriately procured vendor to facilitate the provision of these services.
- 4) The ARPA Program Director is charged with ensuring that Revenue Replacement funds allocated and expended to provide these government services will not be used in such a way as to frustrate

COVID-19 mitigation guidance issued by the Centers for Disease Control, or for any other use prohibited by the Final Rule or any applicable state or federal law.

5) Expenditure of these funds, as authorized by this Resolution, shall be contingent on the continued appropriation and availability of ARPA Revenue Replacement funds for this purpose and in no event shall be used for any expenses not obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

RESOLUTION FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT FUNDS FOR GOVERNMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, Coosa County, Alabama (the "County") has received American Rescue Plan Act fiscal recovery funds ("ARPA funds") and is charged with ensuring that such funds are expended in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of final rule published by the United States Department of Treasury dated January 6, 2022, the County has duly elected to designate a standard allowance of up to \$10,000,000 of its ARPA funds, not to exceed the County's total ARPA funds award, as revenue replacement ("revenue replacement funds"); and

WHEREAS, the County may use revenue replacement funds to fund government services; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that there is a need to support emergency response and assistance services in the County; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that the procurement of the following ambulance is a necessary, reasonable, and proportionate measure to facilitate the provision of these government services:

2022 Ford E-350 with SEC from Southern Emergency Consultants, LLC, for the cost of \$218,794.00; and

WHEREAS, the County has identified the vendor from which to procure this ambulance in a manner consistent with state laws and federal guidelines, as required by the terms and conditions of the ARPA as it relates to the expenditure of revenue replacement funds; and

WHEREAS, contemporaneously the County has been awarded a rural provider equipment grant from the Alabama Council of Emergency Medical Services, Inc., a granting agent on behalf of the Alabama Office of Emergency Medical Services, to support the purchase of an ambulance; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the terms and conditions of the grant, the County has received reimbursement from the Alabama Council of Emergency Services, Inc., in the amount of \$164,095.50 to support the purchase of this ambulance; and

WHEREAS, the County intends to utilize ARPA funds to cover the County's portion of the matching contribution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION as follows:

- 1) The County shall use up to \$54,698.50 of ARPA funds, which are hereby designated as revenue replacement funds, to facilitate the provision of the government services described herein.
- 2) The Coosa County Commission is hereby authorized to expend these funds to facilitate the provision of these services.

- 3) The ARPA Program Director is charged with ensuring that revenue replacement funds allocated and expended to provide these government services will not be used in such a way as to frustrate COVID-19 mitigation guidance issued by the Centers for Disease Control, or for any other use prohibited by the Final Rule or any applicable state or federal law.
- 4) Expenditure of these funds, as authorized by this Resolution, shall be contingent on the continued appropriation and availability of ARPA Revenue Replacement funds for this purpose and in no event shall be used for any expenses not obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026.

This agreement is made this the 16th day of November, 2022, between Coosa County, hereinafter referred to as County and DONALD W. EASON, hereinafter referred to as County Engineer.

ARTICLE ONE

TERM OF EMPLOYMENT: The County herein employs the County Engineer and the County Engineer hereby accepts employment with the County for a period of time beginning upon the date of this Agreement and continuing until the end of the term of office of the current Commission, provided, however, that this Agreement may be terminated earlier as hereinafter provided. The County Engineer agrees to and shall reside in Coosa County during his term of employment.

ARTICLE TWO

DUTIES OF COUNTY ENGINEER: The County Engineer is hereby employed as the County Engineer of Coosa County and is to perform the functions and duties commonly discharged by the County Engineer under the Unit System type of Government. The County Engineer shall have the following duties and responsibilities which shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

Those duties and functions listed in Exhibit A, Job Description, attached hereto.

Report directly to the County Commission and its Chairman.

In conducting the duties and obligations of the County Engineer of Coosa County, the

County Engineer understands that all of his official duties are subject to review and approval of the Coosa County Commission.

ARTICLE THREE

COMPENSATION: The initial salary shall be One Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-Four and NO/100 Dollars (\$136,224.00) per annum, payable in equal installments in the same manner that other County employees are paid, consistent with the Coosa County bookkeeping system, and prorated for any partial employment period. This salary shall be increased on the first anniversary date of this Agreement, and each anniversary date thereafter, to an amount equal to the maximum annual salary amount set by the salary scale for "State Participation for County Engineers Pay Grade ARSS" thank of affact 17001. State 2001

ARTICLE FOUR

BENEFITS: The County agrees to include the County Engineer in any and all hospital, surgical, dental, and/or other medical benefit and retirement plans, and any other insurance benefit plan granted and given to other County employees. The County agrees to pay the premiums for said hospital and medical benefits, as well as other employment benefits offered to the County Engineer, in the same amount, and under the same terms and conditions as those premiums are paid for other employees of the County. All other benefits, other than those specifically setforth herein, shall be the same as currently provided to general County employees pursuant to the current Policy covering said benefits.

VACATION: The County Engineer shall be entitled to the same paid vacation leave as are other County employees, and shall also be entitled to credit toward said vacation leave for each year of previous employment as the County Engineer.

SICK LEAVE: The County Engineer shall be entitled to the sick leave benefits granted to all Coosa County employees in accordance with the current Policy.

HOLIDAYS: The County Engineer shall be entitled to a holiday with full pay on any and all holidays granted to other County employees.

ARTICLE FIVE

TERMINATION:

BY THE COUNTY ENGINEER: This agreement may be terminated by the County Engineer by giving sixty (60) days written notice of said termination to the County. Such termination shall not prejudice any other remedy to which the terminating party may be entitled either at law, in equity, or under this Agreement.

BY COUNTY: The County may immediately terminate this Agreement upon the occurrence of any one of the following occurrences without having to compensate the County Engineer for any salary, benefits or deferred compensation to which he would have been entitled under the remaining term of this contract:

- (a) County Engineer's conviction of a crime of moral turpitude;
- (b) County Engineer's violation of the Coosa County drug-free work-place policy;
- (c) County Engineer's becoming incapacitated to physically or mentally perform the duties as required by the Commission;
- (d) County Engineer's gross insubordination as determined by a majority vote of the Commission;

(e) County Engineer's violation of any Federal or State laws which govern Employment practices, as determined by a Court of competent jurisdiction.

EFFECT OF TERMINATION ON COMPENSATION: In the event of the termination of this Agreement prior to the completion of the terms of employment as specified herein, the County Engineer shall be entitled to the compensation earned by him prior to the date of termination as provided for in this Agreement (including vacation and holiday leave, and other accrued benefits), computed pro rata, up to and including that date. The County Engineer shall be entitled to no further compensation as of the date of termination except as set forth in this contract as of the date of termination.

ATTORNEY AND OTHER FEES UPON DEFAULT: If either of the respective parties hereto shall default in any of the covenants herein so as to require the party not in default to commence legal or equitable action against the defaulting party, the defaulting party shall pay all

of the other party's reasonable attorney fees and costs incurred by said non-defaulting party.

ARTICLE SIX

GENERAL PROVISIONS: Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effected either by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid with return receipt requested. Mail notices shall be addressed to the parties at their current mailing address. Notices delivered personally shall be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices shall be deemed communicated as of three (3) days after mailing.

LAW GOVERNING AGREEMENT: This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the Laws of the State of Alabama.

PAYMENT OF MONIES DUE DECEASED COUNTY ENGINEER: If the County Engineer dies prior to the expiration of the term of employment, any monies that may be due him from the County under this Agreement as of the date of his death shall be paid to his Personal Representative.

LEGAL CONSTRUCTION: In the event that one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall, for any reason, be field to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.
